The morning we returned I had fixed John something to eat and he began to share with me that he had never sat a white person's table, eaten with them on their dishes, or shared their toilet. He was happy that we trusted him and loved him and he thanked us. This made me sad because I knew John had worked for some people in South Africa during apartheid. During those days, he was not allowed to enter his employer's home, eat at his table, or even eat off the same dishes as them and never allowed to use their toilet. Those times left a shadow in the hearts of the people. God made all men in His image and each of us are precious to Him. I am so glad that a great and powerful God placed value on each of us. We are not worthy but He does it anyway. That is called love. Jesus said to love others as we love ourselves.
